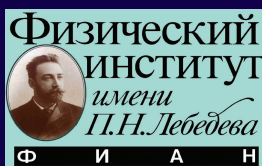

Since 1994 *Physics – Uspekhi* has been published jointly by Uspekhi Fizicheskikh Nauk and Turpion Ltd. From the beginning of 1996 *Physics – Uspekhi* is being translated, typeset and edited in Moscow by Uspekhi Fizicheskikh Nauk (UFN), from 2009 published by Uspekhi Fizicheskikh Nauk, Moscow, printed by Page Bros, Norwich, UK.
